It is a matter of pleasure for me to convey my greetings to the delegates attending the ISKSAA 2014 being held in Hotel The Leela Ambience Gurgaon.

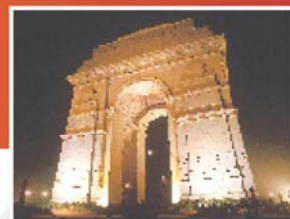
