Mr Kelly has been a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital, Oswestry since 1995 and has a super-specialist interest in shoulder arthroplasty in young patients. He is the Clinical Audit Lead for the Hospital and Chairman of the Medical Advisory Committee. Mr Kelly is Former Secretary of the British Elbow and Shoulder Society (BESS).

Mr Kelly undertook his orthopaedic training in Ireland, Stoke and Oswestry. He completed his fellowships at the Pulvertaft Hand Centre and was the first Copeland Fellow at Reading under Steve Copeland.

He is a keen teacher and runs the annual Oswestry Shoulder and Elbow Course. He has trained many orthopaedic trainees and is a regular contributor to the British Elbow and Shoulder Society, British Orthopaedic Association, Irish Shoulder and Elbow Society and the British Society for Surgery of the Hand.

Mr Kelly is a keen researcher and is widely published. His current interests include shoulder arthroplasty and he is a member of the Mathys European team that developed the short stem prosthesis. Currently he is collaborating on the development of a generic software 3D planning programme for shoulder arthroplasty and is Chief Investigator of the Tennis Elbow Platelet Rich Plasma Injection Study (TEPIS).

His other interests include improving his golf and he is enthusiastic about yoga and Pilates.
