From the moment of selection to travel and accommodation, the entire journey was an enriching experience. Landing in Manchester from the scorching Indian summer to the cool breeze of the UK, and staying in Wigan with daily bus commutes to the renowned **Wrightington Hospital**, was a refreshing shift. The hospital's legacy—being the birthplace of modern hip replacement by Sir John Charnley—made every day feel historic.

My special thanks go to Prof. Raj Murali, who despite his demanding schedule, personally monitored our progress and made us feel truly welcomed. Just before the operation theatre he used to brief all the staff involved in operation theatre about whole day programme, what are they going to do today, what are the critical steps in the surgery and about arrangement of special equipment's etc. We attended the preop case discussion and crucial steps of RSA, TSA, customised RSA, Special thanks to **Dr. Sudhakar**, whose practical demonstrations in **shoulder arthroscopy** and patient interactions were extremely helpful.

We were also privileged to observe numerous hip and knee arthroplasties—both primary and complex revisions, including customised cases—under distinguished surgeons like Dr. Henry Wynn Jones, Dr. Anil Gambhir, Dr. Peter Kay, and Dr. George Pavlovs. Their openness in sharing surgical tips, intraoperative pearls, and case planning deeply enriched our understanding.
